Provide an appropriate title for your article.

Recently, many of your schoolmates have told you that they do not like the way the morning assembly is conducted and that it should be changed. They have asked you to write a letter to the Principal. Write the letter explaining why students dislike the way the morning assembly is held, and suggest an alternative way of conducting it. Give three reasons to support your suggestion. Sign your letter 'Chris Wong'.
