As you know, the Anniversary Committee would like to publish a special Anniversary Newsletter to commemorate the 35th anniversary of Wah Fu College. I would like you to write an article about Wah Fu College for the Newsletter. The title of the article is 'Wah Fu College - Yesterday and Today'.

Then you should contrast <u>what the school was like in 1967</u> with <u>what it is like today</u>. You will need to talk about the school *premises* - the location, the building and the facilities. Obviously you will also want to discuss the *people* - the size and composition of the student body and the staff. You will also need to describe the school *philosophy* - the mission and the curriculum.

You can decide for yourself exactly how to organise the article. You should end by encouraging readers to visit the Wah Fu College web site, where they can learn more about our college.

Documents about the opening of Wah Fu College (WFC)

Transcript of part of a speech made by the Chairman of the Aberdeen Kaifong Association on the opening day of Wah Fu College, 1 December, 1967

I am very proud to be here today to celebrate the opening of Wah Fu College.

As all of you know, Aberdeen is a very traditional fishing village with a core of hard-working families, many of whom live on their boats. Because of the nature of the fishing industry, with boats and families out at sea for long periods of time, many of the children in our area have not had adequate opportunities for a full education.

Therefore, the Wah Fu College mission is to provide education for the children of families in the fishing trade. In addition to a traditional education, we want to offer them the chance to learn practical, vocational skills.

The Aberdeen Kai Fong Association began discussing our ideas for a school almost four years ago, in early 1964. When we were allocated this piece of land for the school in 1965, it was just a field, and we had a number of difficulties to face from the beginning. The waterfalls and rivers which make this part of Hong Kong so beautiful caused us plenty of problems, and we needed to do a lot of work to be sure the foundations of the building were strong.

We are happy that we have chosen a most auspicious day to start and that all our problems are behind us. I am sure you will agree that the school building looks splendid and that we have selected a fine staff of teachers, Miss Li, Mr Siu, Mrs Au, Mr Chan and Mr Law.

We have 117 students here today, all males. Of course, we have great hopes of attracting female students to the school in the coming years.


Sammy Lo's notes from a recent interview with Mr Abraham Lee, the first principal of Wah Fu College

Interview with Mr Lee on 8 March, 2002

- Aberdeen Kaifong Association applied to Gov't for land, Dec. 1964.
- planned opening date for school delayed almost three months until 1 December, 1967 due to flooding and flood damage caused by a typhoon
- single-storey building in 1967
- only Forms 1 and 2 in first year (2 x F1, 1 x F2)
- facilities in school very limited in first year
- Mr Lee says he grew up near the first site of WFC and therefore had very fond memories of the area.
- Mr Lee taught mathematics for 15 years before becoming WFC principal.
- Mr Lee enjoys his retirement; likes to do gardening.


The layout of Wah Fu College, 1967




Charts showing statistics about Wah Fu College




Proportion of male and female students

Mr Foo's Millennium Speech

The Principal, Mr Foo, made a speech at the Wah Fu College celebrations for the new Millennium.

Mr Foo commented that 'students leaving WFC today are markedly different to those first graduates in the early 70s.' He went on to explain that the school's philosophy had changed greatly, and that instead of training students in more practical, manual skills, our curriculum now reflects 21st century needs. 'Our mission has evolved,' he said. 'It is now to provide quality education for the whole of Hong Kong, and to prepare our students for the challenges of the modern workplace and a knowledge-based society.'

Admission of WFC graduates to university has increased greatly, particularly amongst girls. 'We didn't have any female students until 1971 and even in 1976 only ten percent of our students were girls,' said Mr Foo. 'Who would have believed back then that last year we would have nine out of ten of our female graduates gaining places at universities?' He went on to give another example of success – two WFC students winning a gold medal in the Outstanding Student Competition last year.

The Principal also noted the success of the school's anniversary celebrations, which commenced in 1992 with the 25th anniversary. He said such celebrations resulted in a great boost to school funds, staff morale and students' academic achievements. It was decided then that anniversary celebrations would be held every five years, with the next being the 35th anniversary in 2002. 'The staff and students are proud of the history of their school,' he said. 'Reminding them of its humble beginnings, as a school for the children of the fishing community living in the Wah Fu area, helps them to recognise the great achievements and progress made since then. This in turn encourages them to make their own contribution to history.'

The Principal also mentioned his pride in the school's recycling programme and its efforts to become a 'paperless school'. WFC has great hopes of winning the first Green School of the Year Award this year.

Mr Foo ended by expressing his thanks to the school's NET, Miss Jones, who is leaving the school in July 2000 to return to her home in the UK before emigrating to Australia and starting a new life there.

Dear Parents 24 September, 1984				
As you know, there was a fire at Wah Fu College last week. Fortunately, no one was seriously hurt although some staff members were taken to hospital suffering from the effects of smoke inhalation.				
I am pleased to say that all students and staff responded promptly to the fire alarm and the building was rapidly evacuated. I am proud of the way the staff worked quickly and efficiently to ensure the safety of the students.				
There was some damage to classroom 14, which will now be closed for repairs until next month. Happily, the other seven classrooms in the East Wing were not affected.				
According to the Fire Services Department, the fire appears to have been caused by an electrical fault. We have had a number of problems with the electrical system ever since we built the East Wing in 1977. We have now had the whole system thoroughly checked by both electricians and the Fire Services Department and we are satisfied that there is no further risk.				
The chances of such occurrences will, of course, be greatly reduced when we move from our original premises on Victoria Road to our new, multi-storey school building on Waterfall Bay Road in September 1985.



Typhoon Ellen is having a lasting effect in Wah Fu this week. Like all their friends in Hong Kong, the students of Wah Fu College got a long weekend at home when the typhoon hit in the early hours of Friday 9 September. However, when they turned up for school the following Monday they found they Were without lights.

Although the storm had passed, two days of heavy rain had caused a river which runs near the school to become very full. The playground quickly flooded and the water then entered the ground floor of the building. There was considerable damage to the floors and furniture and the electrical circuits were also affected. The school will remain closed for repairs until Monday, 19 September.

Mr Abraham Lee, the principal of Wah Fu College, has announced that he will be taking early retirement at the end of the 1995-1996 academic year.

This is much earlier than expected and it means that Mr Lee will not be at the helm for the celebrations organised for the return of Hong Kong to China in 1997.

'It's a great disappointment,' he said. 'But my doctor has advised me that this is the best thing for my health.'

Mr Lee suffered a slight stroke earlier this year but returned to work soon after. His replacement has not yet been announced but is expected to take up the post in August.

Clinton Visits Hong Kong


Former US President Bill Clinton arrived in Hong Kong yesterday for his second visit since he left office in January 2001.

Mr Clinton was met at Chek Lap Kok Airport by a welcoming party of Hong Kong Government officials and was taken to his hotel in Central under tight security.

Mr Clinton will be in Hong Kong for four days. He will address a meeting of the Asia Society on Thursday on the role of China in the 21st Century. Because of his special interest in education, Mr Clinton has asked to visit a local school. He will tour Wah Fu College on Friday and will give a talk to the students there on international business. He will also present special awards to Wah Fu College students who have participated in a student exchange programme, Open Hands, with secondary schools in Mainland China. The programme was established in 2000 by Kowloon College, and Wah Fu College joined the scheme in 2001.


